



How Shall You Live This Season?

The month of May has within it three significant liturgical feasts or celebrations – The Ascension of the Lord (May 10), The Day of Pentecost (May 20), and Trinity Sunday (May 27). While we often think of Easter as being a single day, liturgically, it is actually an entire season, which this year ends on Sunday, May 13. We are invited to remember that Jesus, following his resurrection, spent another 40 days before his ascension. We can only imagine what it must have been like for Peter and Mary and the others to continue to be in Christ’s presence following his resurrection!

And yet, in some ways Christianity didn’t start with Jesus’ birth, or his death, or even his ascension. It started with Pentecost — the day the “Holy Spirit” entered a room holding Jesus’ apostles and fell upon them, filling them. This event is what makes the church the church. But I must wonder what it was like for Jesus’ followers for the ten days between these two events. Did they feel abandoned? Were they waiting anxiously for what would happen next? What do you think? How would you have lived out those ten days?

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit came upon the disciples and they were empowered to preach to people from every nation who had come to Jerusalem for the feast. The Acts of the Apostles records that about 3,000 people were added to their number that day.

Pentecost, which means “fiftieth day,” was the Feast of Weeks celebrated by the Jewish people at the end of the grain harvest. Over time, the Feast of Weeks came to be associated with the giving of the Torah to Moses. The Jews saw this event as the founding of the Jewish nation, and early believers were quick to note a parallel with the founding of the Christian church.

The Sunday after Pentecost is Trinity Sunday, when we rejoice in the mystery that God is triune (three-in-one) — Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Pentecost is the beginning of the longest season of the church year. It lasts until Christ the King Sunday, which is right before the first Sunday in Advent.


In some traditions, the whole season is called Pentecost, in others it is simply referred to as “ordinary time.” It is interesting that our Presbyterian Church (USA) official program calendar uses both designations. Thus June 3 is both the “2nd Sunday after Pentecost” and the “9th Sunday in Ordinary Time.”

We are not unlike those first disciples who lived through those ten days between Jesus’ ascension and the coming gift of the

Holy Spirit at Pentecost. We live in the time between the gift of the Spirit, and Christ’s coming again. It’s been a bit longer than ten days, more like 2,000 years and counting.

I believe we have a choice about how we shall live in this time. We can either treat it as “ordinary time” or we can live these days as days of Pentecost – Spirit filled days, where God is still revealing God’s very self to us through the work of God’s Holy Spirit. How shall you choose to live this season?

Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church. The Holy Spirit remains with us still, connecting us with the church of the past, continuing to inspire the church of today, and pointing us to the church of the future.

The Pentecost Offering unites us in a church-wide effort to support young people in Christ and inspire them to share their faith, ideas, and unique gifts with the church and the world. Studies show that a foundation of faith established during childhood through young adulthood, helps ensure lifelong faith and service.

year of intentional service where they discern God's call upon their lives by our *Young Adult Volunteer Program*.

Forty per cent of this offering will be retained by Rye Presbyterian Church to continue funding our Baby Box Program, which supports new moms through the Open Door Family Medical Center in Port Chester.

Back to the Beginning

The confirmation class has been hard at work over the last eight months learning the basics of the faith, reflecting on their own beliefs, and thinking about how their faith in God is

to be lived in all the details of everyday life. In the last month they have crafted their Statements of Faith – personal statements of where they are in their journey of faith. Each confirmand met individually with an elder of the church to talk about their statements and their plans for beginning their adult life as a follower of Christ and as a member of Rye Presbyterian Church. Following that, the class had a meeting with the full Session to be approved for full adult membership.

Confirmation is a public affirmation of their faith, and a public commitment to continue the growth, learning, and service that is a part of the journey of faith lived in the context of the life of the church. Rather than “graduation,” confirmation truly is the beginning of the next chapter.

On May 6, we will celebrate this new beginning as we worship together and welcome these new members to the table of fellowship.

The festivities will begin with a breakfast for confirmands and their families at 8:45 a.m. in the Assembly Room. Worship with Confirmation and Communion will be at 10:00 a.m. There, with the confirmands, we can all reconfirm our commitment to be a part of God's transforming work in the world!

One way our congregation provides for people in need is through a team of equipped caregivers—our Stephen Ministers. The initial fifty-hour training, RPC's Caring Connections, lays the foundation for high-quality, confidential, Christ-centered care. Subsequently, Peer Supervision and Continuing Education programs encourage RPC Stephen Ministers to gain insight, develop relational skills, and deepen their faith.

Over the past year, classic Stephen Ministry training topics such as “maintaining healthy boundaries” and “assertiveness in caregiving” were reviewed. Workshops in Myers-Briggs personalities, mindfulness, and prayer collage enhanced caregivers' self-awareness and spiritual disciplines. Experts from the area were invited to clarify how addiction impacts families and to facilitate discussion on strategies for counseling those who have experienced loss.

Church & Justice, Adult Education, Coming Home, Mobile Shredder

Church and Justice Service, April 8, 2018

At this year's Church and Justice Service, RPC hosted the largest number of formerly incarcerated individuals and their families in the 24-year history of this important event in the life of the church. It featured a room-rocking sermon from Rev. Hector Custodio—"Pastor Bennie" as he is fondly known. He earned a standing ovation for his testimony of the power of education, faith, and hard work in the redemption of men and women in prison.

Another feature was a poem, written by Ja'Far Abbas, class of '98, and read by his brother and fellow prisoner Joe Byrd to honor Ja'Far who died this year. The poem, entitled "*I Never Meant*" was written for his late mother to thank her for her love and to ask her forgiveness for the life he led leading up to prison and the pain and heartbreak it caused her.

As is our tradition, all the elements of the service were led by formerly incarcerated people, some of whom are participants in RPC's Coming Home Program. The service was followed by a luncheon for about 100 people, most of whom were formerly incarcerated and their families, plus young men in the Youth Shelter of Westchester which RPC proudly supports, and a scattering of other people involved in prison ministry. Each got to briefly tell his or her story and many expressed their gratitude for the support RPC has given them over the years.

Next year's Silver Anniversary service will be in the spring of 2019—and we hope as many of you as possible will join in this powerful worship service.







Greetings to the RPC Community from Kristin Bassett Kumar

We are so proud of the meaningful and hands-on learning that takes place at Rye Presbyterian Nursery School. As emergent curriculum studies happen throughout the school year, RPNS educators plan special experiences for the children to enhance their learning. Here are some highlights:

Tape Resist Letters:

Mrs. Laux and Mrs. Quinn always find a way to make learning fun, exciting, and hands-on for the children! You might have noticed the vibrant letters that line the first floor hallway that have



been created by our three-year-olds! The classroom teachers decided to offer the children the idea to create an alphabet out of tape and paint! Beginning letter recognition has always been a huge component in our three-year-old curriculum and making these learning experiences enticing for young children was a priority in Mrs. Laux's and Mrs. Quinn's curriculum planning. The tape was placed on the paper to create different alphabet letters and the children were invited to paint over the tape and paper. Once dry,



the students peeled the tape off to reveal a letter of their choice! This activity was a favorite for the class and was placed in the hall for our school community to enjoy. Thinking outside of the box and offering academic activities like this one aids in the learning process. It makes for activities that are memorable and engaging! Come check out the community alphabet outside their classroom and share the letters with your children!

We certainly do with all the classes as they pass by Mrs. Laux's and Mrs. Quinn's classroom!

Planetarium Visit:

Mrs. Cotter's and Mrs. Prata's afternoon fours class has an interest in

astronomy this year! The classroom teachers listened carefully to the interest of the class and promoted experimentation and exploration on this topic!

Discussions about planets, spaceships, and constellations have taken center stage! The children had thoughtful questions and participated in research around space. To extend the children's curiosity and knowledge, the class went on a field trip to the Stamford Museum and Planetarium. Throughout the visit, the children gained more information about stars, constellations, and planets. They learned that the North Star helps to guide us and the brightest star is called the Betelgeuse (beetle juice)! At RPNS, we welcome field trips to expand the children's research. It was a special and memorable experience for the class and will extend their learning through the rest of the school year!
