



Clearing the View . . .

During the last three weeks of my sabbatical, we were able to spend time in the Adirondacks at our family cottage. There were cookouts and celebrations, time on the beach, reading, kayaking, as well as a fairly substantial “to-do” list to tackle. Among the many tasks was the regular effort to “clear the view.”

When the cottage was built over 100 years ago, most of what is now forest was farmland and pasture. But it doesn’t take long for the trees to return and for the view of the lake to be crowded out, if not completely obliterated. Over the years, the family has worked to keep a swath of open land from the cottage to the water, through which the lake can be seen. But each year the trees move in. To keep new trees from heading skyward, the open area has to be mowed annually. Where the trees on the sides reach out into the open sunlight, they need to be cut back or cut down to keep some semblance of a view.

In so many ways, it was the perfect metaphor for my sabbatical time. The last three months have been a wonderful gift from you all and from the Lilly Foundation grant – and an amazing time to clear my desk, clear my mind, and “clear the view” spiritually. There was time for study, for retreats, for reading and reflection, as well as solid time with friends and family. What a gift it was!

Yet sitting at my desk here in my first few days back, my question is this. Was it just a break – a temporary pause to refresh before diving back in to life and church and all that entails? Or is there a new way to view life and ministry here together?

First and foremost, I return even more grateful for this church and the privilege of being here among you all. In addition to reading and study and reflection, we were able to visit several other churches for Sunday worship. It made me even more glad for all that we have – an amazing gathering of interesting and talented people wrestling with what it means to be faithful; a devoted staff team that I am privileged to serve with; a gorgeous building that inspires a sense of God’s presence; and worship that is done very, very well.

And yet so quickly our lives can fill to the brim and beyond. Life and work and play and family and volunteering– all good things – can so quickly fill up “the view” and our ability to

pause, breathe, and simply enjoy life and the presence of God’s goodness throughout our lives.

As at the lake, clearing the view is an ongoing task. And I, for one, need to continue to simply stop. To take a “Sabbath” amid a busy week. To make time for the practices of my sabbatical – reading, exercise, intentional time with others, centering prayer (a form of meditation), and quiet.

As a church, this month we will begin two similar “practices” that I hope will help to “clear our view” and deepen our connection to God amid busy lives. Once a month, starting on Saturday, October 20, the Saturday service will be a “contemplative” service. Similar in length, though differing in format, this service will incorporate music, quiet centering prayer, and the ancient

practice of *lectio divina*, where instead of a sermon, together we will listen for the voice of God speaking to us through scripture. (For e-version – [Click here](#) to learn more about Centering Prayer, and [here](#) to learn about *lectio divina*.)

In addition, this month we will kick off our “Show up & Make” event. Another fruit of our Imagine Initiative, following all three services on the weekend of October 27 and 28 this event will offer the chance to reflect on the themes of worship using art. No artistic skill is necessary, but all ages are invited to be a part of engaging not simply our minds in our spiritual lives, but our full selves – body, mind, and spirit. Come, show up, & make!

In an age where “mindfulness” is all the rage, these two events blend mindfulness with a Christian spiritual focus – anchoring us deep to the loving presence of God in our daily lives.

It is good to be back among you, and I look forward to sharing more with you about the learnings of my sabbatical, and joining you as together we find ways to “clear the view.”

Each year during the “Season of Peace,” which runs through September and ends on World Communion Sunday, which this year is Sunday, October 7, Presbyterians around the world contribute to our “Peace and Global Witness” offering.

This offering exists to support our call to witness and work for peace, from our own local communities, to the far reaches around the world. It seeks to alleviate and end suffering and violence in all settings.

50% of this offering is utilized by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of

violence, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness. One example of this is supporting peace efforts in South Sudan and to help Sudanese people in refugee camps across the border in Uganda.

25% of this offering supports regional Presbyterian mid councils, and 25% stays with our church to build up peace in our community in ways we see fit. Examples of local assistance include funding scholarships for students recognized as peacemakers, resettlement of refugees and supporting shelters where those who are abused may find refuge.

We hope that you will join us in our

Peace and Global Witness offering to help promote our witness and work for peace, both here in our local community, and throughout the world.

We will have offering envelopes in the Sanctuary pews. We will be accepting this offering until Sunday, October 7.

Caring Connections



Caring Connections is successfully underway. Twenty-one participants embarked on a 10-week journey in fellowship with one another and in preparation to provide support for those in need.

At the opening retreat, the Stephen Ministry based curriculum introduced trainees to the Caregiver's Compass, a symbol utilized

to chart one's path throughout the training and to remind caregivers of the four important characteristics of spiritual care.

Here are some of the descriptions compiled by this year's class when brainstorming the meaning of each compass point:

- **Compassionate:** empathy-in-action, selfless, present, non-judgmental, appreciative, gentle strength, natural and/or learned
- **Full of Faith:** open to God, originating in love, trusts higher power, full vessel, confident in God's capacity, spiritual, able to avoid “cringe-worthy” words or clichés, believes God is the cure-giver
- **Skilled:** honed, flexible, fine-tuned, trained, practiced, active listener, maintains boundaries, shared goals, willing to ask for help, familiar with theology, comfortable with the unknown
- **Trustworthy:** shows up, maintains confidences, consistent, reliable, considers another valuable, steady, available, safe, prioritizes another's need

The Caregiver's Compass is a symbol reminding us that high-quality, confidential, one-to-one Christ-centered care is available at Rye Presbyterian Church. church leaders and officers, and anyone else who wants to be informed.


To that end, we are offering three 30-minute orientation sessions at which these new procedures will be introduced and reviewed. You only need to attend one of the three.

Introducing Eddie Zheng, Our First Knock Intern in Sacred Music

We will welcome Eddie Zheng, our first Knock Intern in Sacred Music, into our midst on October 7. Eddie is a freshman at the Juilliard School, where he studies organ with Paul Jacobs. He was a student of Matthew Lewis for two years in Juilliard Pre-College Division. He also was a student at the McGill Organ Academy and the Oregon Bach Festival Organ Institute in the summer of 2017. He won first prize at the 17th annual West Chester University (Penn.) organ competition and has performed

in three major concert halls in Beijing. He came to the organ in 2015 following ten years of piano studies. Eddie's hobbies include filmmaking, hip-hop music, and playing ice hockey.

The goal of this internship in sacred music, funded this year by the Peter B. Knock Memorial Fund, is to provide a hands-on educational experience to a college or university student whose courses include the many aspects of liturgical music. You will

see and hear Eddie do quite a bit of it all, including playing the organ, conducting the Chancel Choir, preparing music for rehearsals, and accompanying the Children's and the Youth Choirs – all with guidance and encouragement from me, Lisa, and the pastors.

Following two pieces for orchestra only (the *Divertimento No. 10*, K. 247, by Mozart, and the *Holberg Suite* by Grieg, Simon will rejoin the ensemble to conclude the concert with the elegant warmth and melodies of the *Concerto No. 1 in F Major*, op. 137, by Josef Rheinberger. This is a great event for all ages.
